This policy defines the administration of medication to youth at the SYSC.

Required Practices
Any deviations to the following information must be documented with Supervisory Approval.

- I. SYSC staff shall follow all state and federal regulations relating to the dispensing, distributing, and administering of medications.
- II. All residential staff shall complete the Red Cross First Aid course, which includes training in the use of inhalers and EpiPens.
- III. Upon a youth's admission to SYSC, the nurse shall obtain the youth's medication information.
 - A. The nurse shall verify any medications with the prescribing physician, pharmacy, or last placement.
- IV. Medications that youth bring with them to SYSC may only be used when:
 - A. The medication has been verified as noted above;
 - B. There is a physician's order to administer the medication;
 - C. The label is accurate and the medication is not out of date;
 - D. The medication can be accurately identified as being the medication noted on the label; and
 - E. There is no evidence of tampering with the label or the medication.
- V. All orders shall be written on the Physician's Order Sheet (Form 2261) and filled by the SYSC designated pharmacy.

- VI. Only registered nurses and licensed physicians shall administer medications (both prescribed and over-the-counter) to youth at the SYSC with the following exceptions:
 - A. Inhalers;
 - B. Life-saving Epinephrine (prepackaged EpiPens) administered by trained employees in emergency situations when the nurse or physician is not available; and
 - C. Medications provided by the nurse or physician for the purpose of administration to the youth when the youth is off-grounds.
- VII. SYSC Medication Administration Rules (Form 2273) shall be posted for the youth to review.
- VIII. Consequences for hoarding and sharing medications shall be enforced.
 - A. Consequences shall be discussed upon a youth's admission to the facility so that the youth is clear about expectations of acceptable behavior.
 - B. Non-compliance shall be addressed immediately by medical department staff.
- IX. Residential staff will check with the Medical Department prior to taking youth off-campus to determine the need to carry prescribed medications with them.
- X. The nurse will determine what, if any medications need to travel with the youth and provide the staff member with a limited amount of any medication necessary (only enough for the projected time off grounds), along with instructions as to the administration of said medication.
- XI. Intravenous drug therapies must be ordered by the physician and managed by the Nurse in consultation with the physician.
- XII. All medication distributed shall be documented appropriately by the Nurse who distributed the medication.
