## **Purpose**

To establish the criteria for determining Title IV-B eligibility and the Title IV-B services available to children and their families.

## **Policy**

- I. Families with children may receive social services under Title IV-B regardless of their income status. Due to the limited amount of funds allotted to this program and the District Offices, District Office child protective service workers must make a determination of the child's need for the requested service.
- II. For families with children to receive Title IV-B services, one of the following conditions must be met:
  - A case plan must be actively in place while the child and/or family is receiving a direct A. service in one of the DCYF Programs, or
  - The situation must come to the attention of DCYF via an allegation of abuse and/or neglect B. of a child.
