<b>MEMORANDUM SUMMARY</b>
<p>The purpose of this memorandum is to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Clarify the eligibility status of individuals receiving CFI services</li> </ul>

CFI participants that appeal a denial of a redetermination of CFI eligibility, pursuant to He-E 801.07(e)(2)c.2., shall have CFI eligibility continue until at least 30 days after a final eligibility decision is made by the Administrative Appeals Unit. Providers will continue to be paid as normal for CFI services provided while participants remain open pending appeal and for 30 days afterwards if the hearing determines the participant to be ineligible for services. If a participant is determined to be ineligible, CFI providers will not be liable for the services that were paid during the period the participant was open pending an appeal.
